- This memorandum is filed on behalf of Auckland Council
 (Council) in response to paragraph 5 of the direction from the
 Independent Hearing Panel (Panel) of 18 September 2024
 (Direction). The Panel's Direction concerns hearings for the
 Business Metropolitan Centre zone (Hearing Topic 016B) and
 Sylvia Park precinct (Hearing Topic 020AY) on 25 and 26
 November 2024.
- 2 Paragraph 5 of the Direction stated:
 - 5. Where Council is planning on providing evidence on submission points that have not been allocated to this hearing the Panel requests that the Council advises the Senior Hearings Advisor by midday Monday 7 October 2024 of the submitter and the relevant submission point. The Hearings Advisor will then advise those submitters of Council's intent to file evidence on their submission point.
- As the Council previously advised in its memorandum dated 10 September 2024, there are submission points allocated to other hearing topics which also seek to amend heights in the Metropolitan Centre zone. The Panel has requested that the Council advise the Panel where it is planning on providing evidence on submission points not allocated to Hearing Topic 016B in order that submitters can be advised of this.
